1. Topic: World History
2. Geography
  - a. Chronological survey of physical and political geography
3. History
  - a. Chronological survey of world history from Creation to the Reformation (ninth grade Ancient History course)
  - b. Chronological survey of world history from the Reformation to the present (tenth grade Modern History course)
4. Government
  - a. The relationship between Christians and the world's political systems
5. Economics
  - a. Comparative economics from both a historical and geographical perspective
6. Religion
  - a. Focus on Western, Judeo-Christian heritage, while also surveying the contributions of Asian, African, and Latin American cultures
7. Culture
